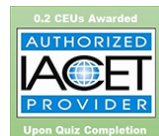

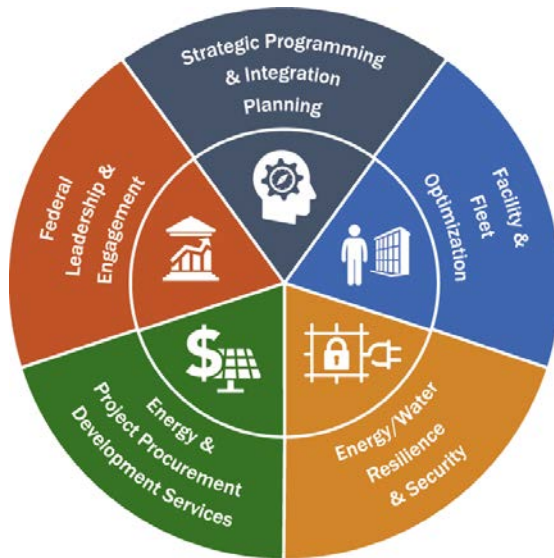

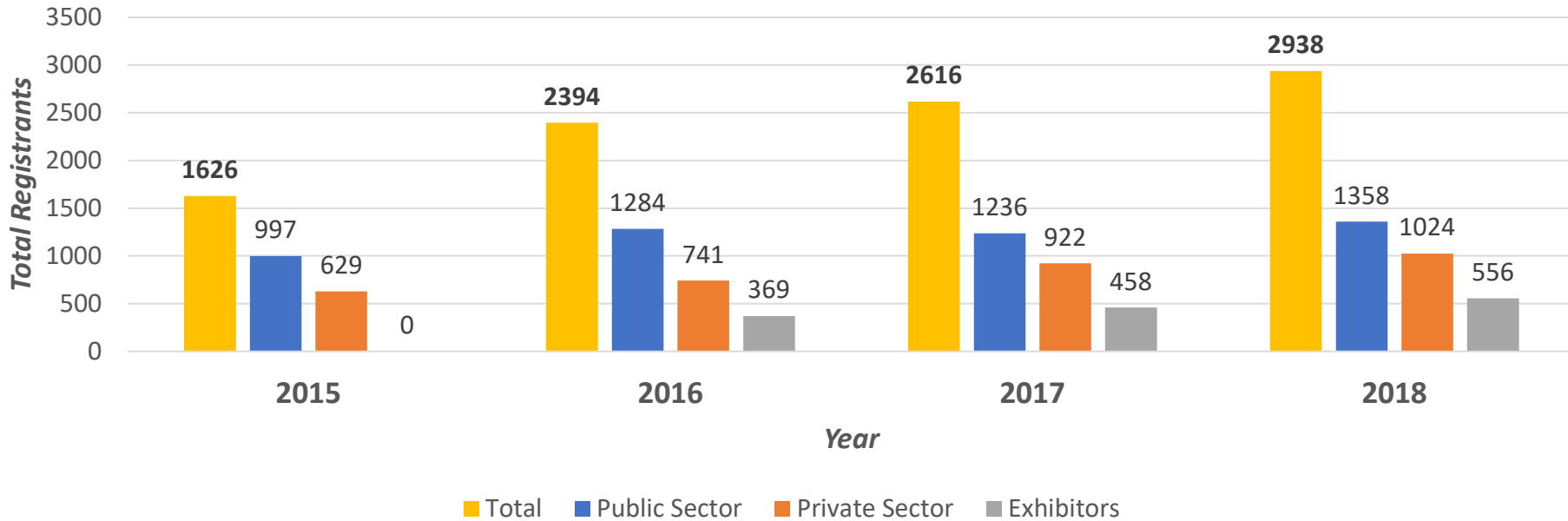

Energy Exchange Registration: 2015-2018

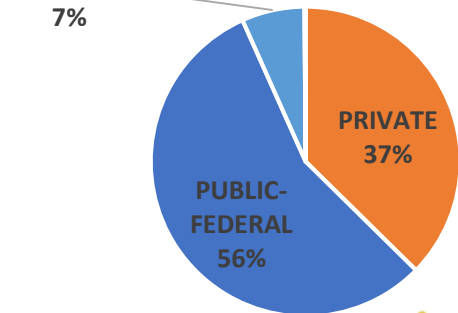

Public vs. Private

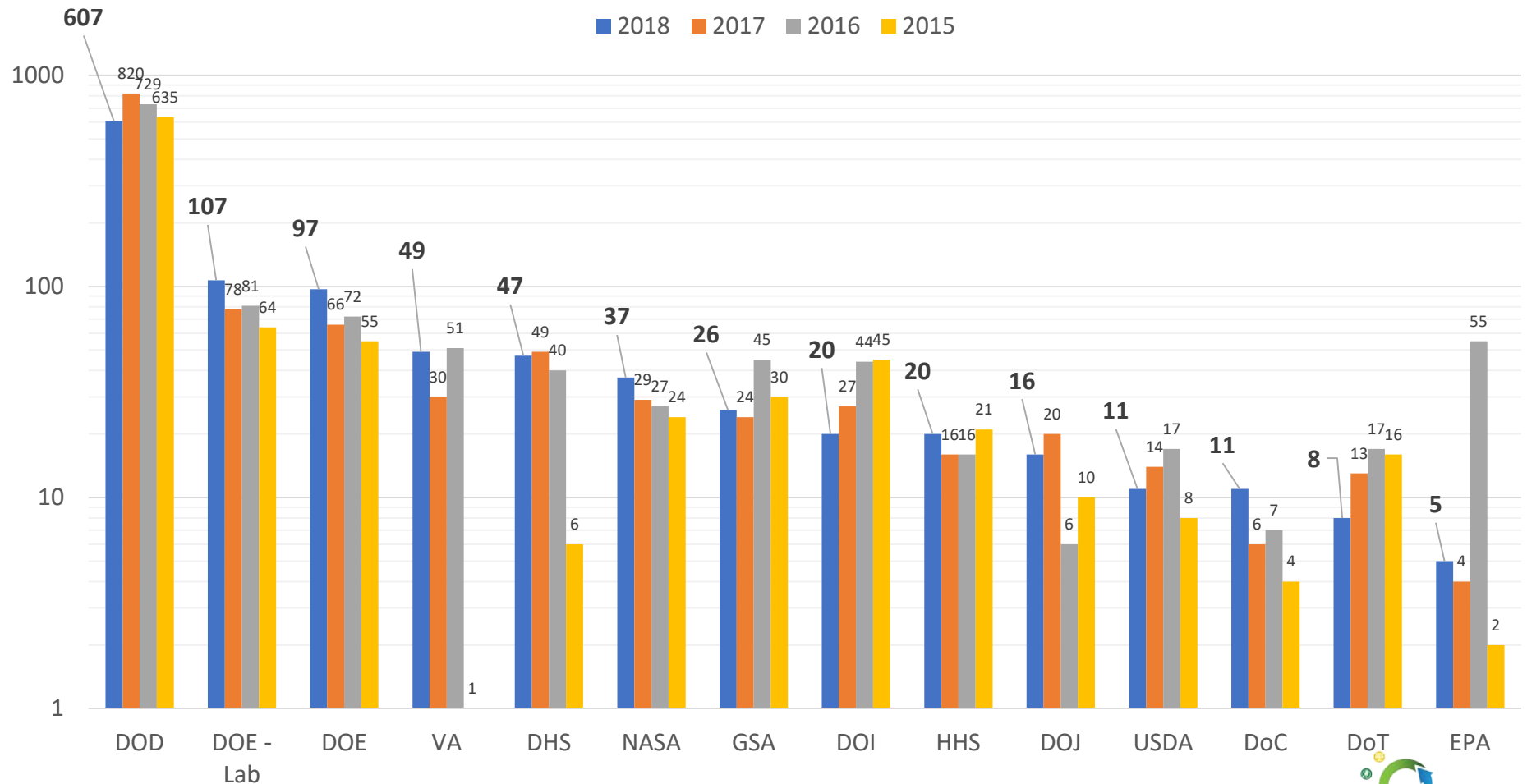


Federal Attendance (10+): 2015-2018
